

Weekend Camp Equipment Checklist

You will be sleeping in tents in a camp environment without electricity. We suggest that leaders and Scouts bring only what they need – you will have to carry everything to your site. Please dress appropriately for expected weather conditions (think layers!). Scouts should have already eaten dinner or bring a brown bag dinner for Friday.

- Complete Class A Uniform with hat and belt, no neckerchief or slide
- 2 Sets of clothing and underwear
- Sturdy hiking shoes and sneakers
- 2 Pairs of socks (including extra Scout socks if traveling in Scout shorts)
- Towel
- Raincoat or poncho
- Sleeping bag and pillow
- Sleeping pad
- Sleepwear
- Knit Cap
- Personal mess kit (plate, bowl, fork, knife, spoon, cup)
- Washcloth and soap
- Toothbrush and paste
- Water Bottle (re-usable, filled)
- Non-aerosol insect repellent
- Sunscreen lotion
- Flashlight and/or electric lantern

- Scout Handbook
- Camp chair
- Day pack/Book bag
- Pencil/pen & notebook
- Extra flashlight batteries and bulbs

Optional Items

- Flat sheet (use if it is too hot for the sleeping bag)
- Compass
- Totin-Chip Card
- Fireman-Chit Card
- Pocket knife
- Personal first-aid kit
- Disposable Camera
- Book to read
- Playing cards/Travel games, etc...
- Spending money

Scouts should bring a sturdy duffel bag to carry everything in. **Mark all items with the Scout's name in permanent marker.** In addition to the above items all adults will need to provide their own tent.

Scouts do NOT bring: Tents, Axe, hatchet, sheath knife, matches, **cell phones, electronic gadgets and toys,** bicycles, TV, radio, expensive watches and jewelry, and things you don't want to lose. Scouts do not bring food other than a bag lunch for Friday (unless you are the Patrol grubmaster).
